Executive Director Report for Board Meeting November 14, 2023

Operations:

- Computer security work has been completed.
- Savings account is being transferred to a Money Market account with a higher interest rate.

Grantmaking:

- General Operating Support Grants Kjel and Kara reviewed a third batch of these with 5
 applications to be proposed to the Board for approval.
- Organizational Programming Grants 63 applications were reviewed by the panelists (35 Legacy, 19 Programming, and 9 Small Towns/Rural Areas). Based on the scores and available funding, 27 Legacy grants for a total of \$226,460; 9 Programming grants for a total of \$43,650; and 8 Small Towns grants for a total of \$39,800 (grand total of \$309,910) will be presented to the Board for approval at the November meeting.

MSAB/McKnight:

- Office of Legislative Audit (OLA) – MSAB and the Regional Arts Councils are undergoing an OLA audit focused on our grant award process. I participated in a Zoom meeting with the auditors and other RAC directors to answer questions on October 30. OLA sent a follow up e-mail with questions specific to SEMAC on November 3. I responded to these on November 10.

Office Space:

- Current property manager has begun advertising our space. We requested a 60-day notice.
- Working with RGI Group, we have identified two potential spaces, one at 800 sq ft across W Circle Drive for \$1,600 and one at 400 sq ft near Broadway and 37th for \$1,200.
- Also being considered is the potential of renting an office for \$1,000 in a co-office space that RGI may be incorporating into a new office building they are constructing off of W Circle Drive and scheduled to open in April.
- Karen and I are willing to work from home for a month or two, if we have to vacate our space before finding a new one.

RE: Recommended Stipends for Boards & Panels

I recommend that SEMAC adopt a new schedule of stipends for Board and Grant Panel service as outlined below. This recommendation is largely based on SEMAC's desires to recruit and retain board and panel members from equity populations.

By providing generous stipends, board and panel members can recover lost wages, travel time, the costs of child or elder care, etc. While this is not the only way to reduce barriers to participation, it is one strategy that other organizations have used successfully.

Other non profit sectors have offered board stipends for years. The arts sector lags behind in this area. SEMAC is in a unique position to be a leader in this area and demonstrate the best practices to the arts community because our budget will support a generous stipend in addition to mileage reimbursement.

Board members would be able to choose to accept the stipend or let the funds remain with SEMAC to support the mission.

The proposed stipends are generous. After analyzing the maximum budget impact, which assumes a full board with 100% in person meeting attendance and 100% accepting the stipend, I believe SEMAC can responsibly fund the stipends for an 18 month window as a test. If, after the test period, the strategy has not resulted in more participation from equity populations or if the budget impact has been higher than expected, the stipends would sunset at that time.

See attached spreadsheets outlining the budget impact for this recommendation. I expect this memo to be received with healthy questions and debate to guide SEMAC to a final decision.
